The Lewisboro Republican Town Committee met last evening at Cyrus Russell Community House and elected its slate of candidates for this year's local town elections: Charles P. Duffy for Supervisor, Hon. Peter B. DeLucia for Councilman, Frank V. Kelly for Councilman, Hon. Marc A. Seedorf for Town Judge, and Hon. Joann Vasi for Receiver of Taxes. The candidates will be officially presented at a reception to be held this Sunday May 3, 2009 at Nino's Restaurant, Smith Ridge Road in South Salem at 6:00PM. The public is invited.

I am very pleased to present this highly capable and qualified ticket of candidates-two of whom, Marc Seedorf and Joann Vasi are longtime Republican incumbents who have been cross endorsed by the Democrats. This team has the tools to guide the Town of



Lewisboro through these tough economic times, preparing for the future while taking care to preserve those things that make our community special.

One key responsibility of a town supervisor is to be the town's chief financial officer. Charles Duffy, our candidate for supervisor, is a CPA and also holds an MBA from Clarkson University. Mr. Duffy began his career with Coopers & Lybrand where his duties included auditing municipalities. Since then he has had a distinguished career as controller and CFO of several financial trading organizations. Mr. Duffy, who is a registered Conservative, grew up in Mt. Kisco and has lived in Lewisboro with his wife and two young children for over nine years.

Incumbent Councilman Peter DeLucia is generally considered to be the hardest working member of the town board. In his first four years in office Peter has been outspoken on issues of fiscal responsibility and led a reform that implemented more "homeowner-friendly" land use procedures, including the hiring of new consultants. Peter serves as liaison to the Parks and Recreation Department. His many accomplishments include revival of the stalled Little League Press Box project at Town Park and his rescue of the failing pool renovation project. It is clear from the many tough questions Peter asked County officials regarding the Legacy funds proposal for Cross River that Councilman DeLucia is always looking out for our



interests. He has lived in Vista with his wife and twins for over 14 years.

Frank Kelly and his wife are the parents of five children. Frank is a successful trial attorney in the tri-state area, and has been a very involved member of our community particularly with regard to youth athletics. Frank has received over 100 favorable jury verdicts with over 30 published appeals and authored dozens of law journal articles. In addition, Frank is a lieutenant colonel in the United States Army Reserve, having served 14 months in Iraq in 2006-2007 where he supervised over 6000 men and managed over \$2.2 Billion in construction spending, supervised the clearing of IED's from over 340,000 kilometers of roadways and oversaw the construction of power plants and water treatment facilities.



Marc Seedorf is completing his third term as Town Justice where his courtroom has been an example of fairness and efficiency. Judge Seedorf is a former major case prosecutor and a partner in the law firm Seedorf & Scheld. By invitation of the Administrative Judge, he has been an Acting City Court Judge, and has lectured for the Office of Court Administration's Continuing Judicial Education program.

Joann Vasi began working in the Assessor's Office in 1983. Two years later she ran for the position of Receiver of Taxes, and has now served 6 four-year terms. For the past 12 years she has also served as Deputy Supervisor, having been appointed by each of the past 4 Supervisors. Mrs. Vasi has received numerous awards during her tenure, including from the Office of the Westchester County Executive.
